



1. IEP Advisory Board member <u>Nationwide</u> ran a £3m programme, convened by the IEP, called <u>Open Banking for Good</u> which developed and scaled five new fin-tech organisations to help the financial wellbeing of UK citizens. 2. The IEP ran a regional pilot in the West Midlands with the <u>West Midlands Combined</u> <u>Authority</u> (WMCA) and work-placement charity <u>Movement to Work</u> (MtW) to cut youth unemployment in the region. This resulted in over 1,000 new placements and has now been rolled out in other regions across the UK.
