# 01 Promoting registration

Encouraging residents to register to vote, no matter their circumstances

#### **Attitudes to registration**



Our research tells us that **motivation** is the primary factor influencing a person's decision whether to register to vote.

Our new campaign aims to address this by encouraging people to see registering as something to be celebrated – ensuring you have the opportunity to have your voice heard – and associates the act of registering to vote with positivity and enthusiasm.

This, alongside the approval of passers-by, help us to increase the social 'norming' of registering.



electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/partner-charity-or-localcouncil/overseas-friends-family-resources Do you know a British citizen living abroad? Have they been away for more than 15 years? Tell them they can now vote in UK Parliament general elections and by-elections.

If they have lived away for less than 15 years, they can still vote in these elections as before

They will have to confirm their details again every three years, and re-apply for their postal or proxy vote at the same time.

These changes do not apply to local, Scottish Parliament, Senedd or Northern Ireland Assembly elections.
